<b>Western Heritage (3 courses)</b>	
The Western Heritage courses are primarily history courses enriched by a study of the art, music, literature, and philosophy of the corresponding time periods. You must take 4 courses to earn credit for all three (History 140 and 141, and one from both HUM 111 or HUM 212/313; or Humanities 110, 111, and 112 with one other course from either HUM 111 and HUM 212/313 equivalents). The Western Heritage sequence credits are awarded on an all or none basis; no partial credit will be given. Please note that credit for HUM 313 will show as "Satisfied Course" as it is an upper division course that cannot be fulfilled by one that is lower division.
