Environmental stewardship centers on the concern for the preservation, restoration, or improvement of the natural environment, such as the conservation of natural resources, prevention of pollution, and certain land use actions.

The person who fills this position should actively advocate the sustainable management of resources, and the protection (and restoration, when necessary) of the natural environment through changes in public policy and individual behavior. The Environmental Stewardship Intern should recognize humanity as a participant in ecosystems, and should therefore focus on ecology, health, and human rights.

The Environmental Stewardship Internship is truly an interdisciplinary educational position that designs programs focused on issues as biodiversity, climate change and global warming, human population, natural disasters, and nature/animal conservation. Most importantly, all programs should encourage students to reflect on how their choices have a direct impact upon the environment.

Particular attention should be paid to environmental matters from a Christian perspective. In addition, efforts should be made to analyze and attempt to understand major social, cultural and public policy issues relative to the environment.

In order to accomplish all of these objectives, the Environmental Stewardship Intern should collaborate with Pepperdine faculty on at least two programs throughout the academic year, specifically as it relates to the present-day realities of environmental problems.
