

**COURSE INFORMATION FALL & SPRING 2009-2010
HEIDELBERG RESIDENTIAL PROGRAM**

Prerequisite: Students must meet all prerequisite requirements for each course they intend on taking overseas. Waivers cannot be issued for students to take courses without meeting prerequisite requirements. General Requirements: While studying in the Heidelberg Program, all students must enroll in 12-18 units including a German course each semester for a letter grade. Students must complete GER 151 or its equivalent by the end of the Spring 2009 semester to participate. There is an additional fee associated with PE courses.

Students will register for their Fall Heidelberg courses online in March during Fall 2009 registration. Students will register for their Spring Heidelberg courses online in November during Spring 2010 registration. Please check your Pepperdine email for your exact registration time.
