

**COURSE INFORMATION FALL & SPRING 2009-2010

Prerequisite: Students must meet all prerequisite requirements for each course they intend on taking overseas. Waivers cannot be issued for students to take courses without meeting prerequisite requirements. General Requirements: While studying in the Shanghai Program, all students must enroll in 12-18 units including a Chinese course each semester for a letter grade.

Students will register for their Fall Shanghai courses online in March during Fall 2009 registration. Students will register for their Spring Shanghai courses online in November during Spring 2010 registration. Please check your Pepperdine email for your exact registration time.
