Prior Research Experiences

1. All faculty (n=9) reported some type of past research experience with undergraduates. Research project assignments linked with coursework (n=5) and Summer Undergraduate Research Projects (SURP) (n=4) were most popular.

Keck Resources

- 2. 8 out of 9 professors reported that the other Keck seminar professors were helpful in designing their Keck seminar.
 - 7 out of 9 professors reported that the spring workshops sponsored by the Dean's Office were helpful.
 - 6 out of 9 professors reported that their student research mentors were helpful.

Undergraduate Research Outcomes

3. 8 out of 9 professors reported that having students participate in the research process was the *most* important outcome of undergraduate research.

5 out of 9 professors reported that motivating students to a higher level of graduate or professional education or a research-related career was **moderately** important to the outcome of undergraduate research.

6 out of 9 professors reported that making a contribution to the field of study and presenting at a conference or being published was *least* important to the outcome of undergraduate research.
