Given the positive response of the University Chaplain's grief support session last month, the Seaver Dean's Office has partnered with the Chaplain to offer a series of sessions to support faculty in situations of grief, loss, and significant transitions. Topics addressed will be stages of loss, being present in times of loss, and navigating uncharted territory. Faculty are invited to attend one or all of the sessions on November 13, December 11, January 29, February 19, and March 25 from 11 AM to 12 PM in Jerene's Room (Appleby Center). No RSVP is required.

Sessions will be guided by Elizabeth Topp, who works in private clinical practice as a therapist with Roots & Wings in Malibu. Elizabeth has a Ph.D. in Transpersonal Psychology and master's degrees in Counseling Psychology and Holistic Human Development. Elizabeth's research and expertise are in the area of presence, guiding participants to rest in the present moment as a strategy for gaining self-awareness, self-regulation, healing, and growth. She has recently provided local community service and teaching related to recovery after the trauma of the Woolsey Fire.

Sabbatical Lunch Series


