Listening to Black Voices

These few resources, far from exhaustive, are meant to assist non-Black community members as they listen to Black students and colleagues and incorporate antiracist pedagogies into their work.



Racial Discrimination in Daily-Life Moments

In their latest article “The Double Burden of Racial Discrimination in Daily-Life Moments,” Seaver College associate professor of psychology Nataria Joseph, alumna Heather Gordon, and fellow psychology researchers study how discrimination contributes to and influences everyday negative emotions including anger and anxiety and exhaust mental coping resources in African American adults. Joseph et al. found that study participants were 62 percent more likely to experience racial discrimination at work. As mental coping resources are exhausted, momentary racial discrimination impacts long-term health and well-being. Read their [study](#) today.
