- They have been laid off or received a lay-off notice from a job.
- They are receiving unemployment benefits due to being laid off or losing a job and are unlikely to return to a previous occupation.
- They were self-employed but are now unemployed due to economic conditions or natural disaster.
- They are a displaced homemaker. A displaced homemaker is generally a person who previously provided unpaid services to the family (e.g., a stay-at-home mom or dad), is no longer supported by a husband or wife, is unemployed or underemployed, and is having trouble finding or upgrading employment.

Please Note: If a person quits work or is dismissed from work for cause, generally he or she is NOT considered a dislocated worker, even if, for example, the person is receiving unemployment benefits.
