Junior Year

- COM 301 Rhetoric and Social Influence (3)
- COM 430^ Family Communication (3)
- COM 483* Small Group Communication (4)
- One or two electives (see list below)

Senior Year

- COM 400 Communication Ethics (3)
- COM 438* Advanced Interpersonal Communication (3)
- COM 519 Communication and Conflict (3)
- COM 595 Communication Internship (1-4) (often taken in summer between junior and senior year)
- One or two electives (see list below)

Electives - During your Junior and Senior year, choose **3** from the following:

- COM 418# Communication in Organizations (4)
- COM 422* Communication Training and Development (3)
- COM 450# Communication and Leadership (4)
- COM 513# Advanced Intercultural Communication (4)
- COM 590 Seminar in Communication (3-4) (with approval of advisor)
