ISL Students Presenting at Conferences

During the SCUSA 2024 conference, I was able to listen and learn from amazing speakers, collaborate and build friendships with other students interested in foreign policy, and learn a little bit more about the academic experience for students of United States Military Academies. This year, the conference was focused on the topic of American foreign policy in a multipolar world, and I participated in a roundtable discussion on managing conflict and cooperation in the Arctic. I learned about ecological and security concerns in the Arctic, and how the United States might work toward solutions, while building connections with experts on the Arctic region and students from around the world.

The Social Sciences Division invited me to attend the 70th Annual MSC Student Conference on National Affairs at Texas A&M which brings together college students from U.S. military academies and top universities to have discussions on critical national issues and create policy proposals. I was able to participate in the "Star Wars" roundtable where we proposed the creation of an international organization to better regulate satellite infrastructure and safeguard connectivity from threats made by adversaries. We presented this to a panel of judges and made it to the final round! The experience taught me the value of dialogue across specializations since it allowed us to combine expertise in U.S. military space capabilities with scholarly knowledge of International Space Law.

Pepperdine's Model United Nations team excelled at four collegiate MUN conferences in the 2024-2025 academic year. At Georgetown University, our most experienced delegates competed in the Adhoc General Assembly, the crisis committee of Joseon Korea (1834), the crisis committee of the USS Nimitz, the crisis committee of the cabinet of Belisario Betancur (1985), and the joint crisis committee of the Federation of Malaya (1963). At UC Santa Barbara, our new delegates' experience with public speaking, negotiation, and resolution writing grew exponentially over the four days. William Hibbard, won "Best Delegate" in a crisis committee! At McGill University in Montreal, the team had delegates in a variety of different committees. William Hibbard, once again, won "Best Delegate" in an ad-hoc crisis committee and a freshman, Camille Day, won "Verbal Commendation" in a General Assembly committee of more than 100 delegates during her first conference. The team finished the season at ChoMUN at the University of Chicago. Congratulations to our future diplomats!

Leo Hawke will be attending the Conference on East-West Cross-Cultural Relations: "Dialogues and exchanges between the Luso-Hispanic World, the Middle East and Asia". He will travel to the conference in Lima, Peru in May where he will present on Chinese immigration in Mexico.

International Studies and Languages Division of Seaver College Celebrates 20th Anniversary with International **Education Week**

The Seaver College International Studies and Languages (ISL) Division celebrated its 20th anniversary as one of Pepperdine University's eight academic divisions by hosting International Education Week on the Malibu campus.

"We study the places, languages and cultures of the globe," says George Carlsen, professor of Hispanic studies and dean of the division. "That's the slogan of ISL; we believe that we are not called to be insular. Rather, we are here to focus on the world around us, to engage with and learn other languages, and to connect with different cultures and peoples. We view it as part of our Christian mission."

This global focus swept over the campus community for one week, as Carlsen and his division produced 10 unique events highlighting. international perspectives for students, faculty, staff, and local residents to enjoy. Soccer games, an introduction to international cuisines, a job fair aimed at assisting international students, salsa dancing lessons, a global chapel, and a cohort of diverse, engaging speakers were some of the events that Seaver College hosted during this celebration. The festivities incorporated all aspects of culturefrom food and language to the arts and athletics. Similar to the celebration, the ISL Division at Pepperdine University is known for its interdisciplinary nature. With four majors (International Studies, French Studies, Hispanic Studies, and Italian Studies) and five minors (Asian Studies, French Studies, German Studies,


Hispanic Studies, and Italian Studies), the program provides students with an opportunity to develop cultural competencies that aid in their professional development.


Hannah Sharp received" Best Speaker" in the EspanYODL #4 spanish debate tournament.
