- I. Course Description:** A study of the essentials of New Testament Greek with exercises in reading and writing, followed by readings from the epistles of John
- II. Objective:** This course is designed to help students develop the basic skills necessary for reading the New Testament in its original language. A three-semester sequence of courses serves this purpose: the first two semesters (GRE 120 and 121) focus on the basics of Greek vocabulary, grammar, and syntax; the third semester (GRE 320) is spent in translating various types of New Testament literature, along with grammatical analysis, vocabulary building, and elementary instruction in textual criticism and exegetical method.

- IV. Class Procedure**
 - Daily quiz
 - Analysis of grammar
 - Review of assigned exercises

 - Daily preparation of exercises and memorization of paradigms
 - Recitation of exercises and paradigms in class
- VI. Testing and Grading**
